

2008 MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR

This is my first report as chair of the Revelstoke Community Foundation. I am privileged to have been a director in the Foundation since its inception in 1998. Personally, it has been a very gratifying experience as a director and donor. In 2007, our accomplishment of attaining almost \$1.2 million dollars in our endowment and distributing in excess of \$41,000 in grants, scholarships, and bursaries is an example of its continuing success and community benefits. Several new funds were established: the McKinnon Family, Gordon Bell Memorial, Rob Lenzi Memorial, Revelstoke Mountain Resort, Railway Museum Endowment, and the Canadian Club.

Our scholarship portfolio continues to grow with accumulated donations of \$318,143. During last year \$10,975 was distributed in 23 awards to graduates of Revelstoke Secondary School. Vic Van Isle Construction Ltd. established an award for persons headed into the construction trades. Gerry and Linda Richard have set up a scholarship for a student pursuing a career in aviation or engineering. The Rich Mickle Family has created a Special Needs Trust fund to provide teaching and educational support for students with language and learning disabilities. These are wonderful examples of people and companies who know that reinvesting in people creates future success.

Unfortunately, Dean Hunter resigned from our board of directors due to work obligations. We certainly thank Dean for his past contributions and wish him continued success in his endeavours. We will look at filling this vacancy as soon as possible. Sadly, Mike Tomlinson passed away last year. Mike was active in our investment committee and was the brother to Jane Swan, an honorary board member of the Foundation.

The board wishes to thank Debra Wozniak for the extraordinary efforts to maintain our organization in efficient running order. Her commitment and dedication are paramount to our success.

In closing I urge anyone who has not considered the Foundation for creating a personal legacy to contact our Debra at our office. The Foundation truly provides a mechanism to further your passions, profession, legacy in your family name, or leave a lasting memory for a departed person. Your donation stays in perpetuity and thus so does the benefit.

REPORT ON FUND DEVELOPMENT

Following on the 2006 success in pushing the Foundation's endowment past the \$1.0M mark, 2007 was just as successful a year in fund development. By the end of 2007, the endowment was close on \$1.2M.

As indicated elsewhere in this Report, new scholarships were established and others received additional capital.

A new fund, established by the McKinnon Family, ties in with the Foundation's thrust of encouraging the development of family legacy funds – a means of forever perpetuating the memory of a family's presence and involvement in the community. Similarly, donations in memory of Gordon Bell have created a fund that will forever perpetuate the memory of the Bell Family's valued role in Revelstoke.

There are a multitude of Revelstoke families that have contributed much to life in this City but that role is in danger of being forgotten as that family presence in the community disappears over time. The establishment of a family legacy fund in the Foundation insures that the family's name will be kept alive through the Foundation's annual reports and in association with the charitable endeavours that the individual funds will support – a form of ongoing community involvement in perpetuity.

Our thanks go to all those generous folk who have supported the Foundation and generated steady growth of the endowment.

It is of particular interest that some seasonal residents and others who have Revelstoke connections because of the Revelstoke Mountain Resort development have chosen to use the Foundation as a means of community involvement. We hope that their initiative will attract the attention of others. Small communities like ours rely on a huge volunteer effort to provide many community services and non resident property owners are not in a position to be a part of that important volunteer effort. Donating to the Foundation provides a very tangible way for them to show their appreciation of the Revelstoke experience and contribute to the services that our many charitable organizations provide.

An article elsewhere in this report tells of the Revelstoke Heritage Railway Society having established an endowment fund within the Foundation. It is an interesting read on how the existence of our Foundation provides access to other sources of funds for local benefit.

At Christmas time many people and businesses are deluged with gifts and mementoes of one sort or another. In recognition of areas of greater need, many have chosen an alternate means of recognizing friends and clients through making donations to charity. Your Foundation has been the recipient of such donations and we mention the concept in the hope that others will be attracted to the idea.

RAILWAY MUSEUM ESTABLISHES ENDOWMENT

Using the Revelstoke Community Foundation and its connections with the Vancouver Foundation (VF), the Revelstoke Heritage Railway Society (RHRS) has been able to attract matching monies from the VF as administrator of the provincial government's BC Arts Renaissance Fund. This provincial program placed \$25M with the VF to support non-profit arts and culture organizations across BC in establishing permanent endowments that will ensure long term financial stability and enable new opportunities for growth.

Eligible organizations have up to 2 years after Jan. 1 2007 to raise a minimum \$10,000 endowment which in turn would attract \$10,000 from the program. The RHRS embarked on its endowment building in September 2007 and reached the \$10,000 target before Christmas – a remarkable accomplishment! The hope is to raise an additional \$10,000 this calendar year, which would result in a total endowment of at least \$40,000. It is not expected that the program will continue past 2008.

We congratulate the RHRS on the establishment of the Railway Museum Endowment Fund and are pleased that it chose the Revelstoke Community Foundation as its endowment managing vehicle. We look forward to working with the RHRS to see the Fund grow over the years and contribute to its financial stability.

In comment on the whole process, Museum Executive Director Roberto Rodriguez said that the Board of Trustees is delighted with the high level of support shown by the community with thanks to the Province and the VF for the program's funding and administration respectively.

SCHOLARSHIP UPDATE

Interest in increasing the scholarship complement for RSS grads continues and this year saw more scholarships established and existing ones augmented. The total capital for scholarships is now at \$300,000 and all but \$60,000 represents new money since your Foundation began promoting this need.

Awards that had additional capital added this past year were the Bill Nihilowicz Bursary, the Selkirk Medical Group Scholarship, the Peter Grauer Memorial Scholarship Fund, the DOKK Bursary Fund, and the Hillcrest Campbell Award Fund. It is noteworthy that the Hillcrest Campbell Challenge is now capitalized at \$32,500 with the challenge still existing for those who like to see their donations trigger additional givings from others.

Newly established awards this year were the G. Richard Scholarship, and the Vic Van Isle Construction Bursary. The former is designated for a student pursuing a career in aeronautics or engineering with a preference for an aeronautics related field. The VVI award is for an RSS student pursuing post-secondary education/training in a construction or safety related trade.

Two other funds were established this year that are of interest on the education front but are not scholarships per se. The proceeds of the Rich Mickle Family Special Needs Trust will be distributed for the benefit of charitable organizations, projects and/or activities to provide teaching and educational support for students with language and learning disabilities. The Revelstoke Canadian Club was forced to terminate this year because of the collapse of the national organization. The Club elected to use some of its residual monies to establish a fund that will support general education projects and scholarships.

HELPING TO BUILD OUR COMMUNITY

The 2007 Grant Review Committee consisting of Chris Swayze, Darryl Willoughby, Chris Beers, Bob Cooper and Vivian Mitchell had the privilege of awarding a new record amount of \$37,343. The complete list of grant recipients is listed below.

Applications are favoured when they address:

- emerging need
- new, more effective ways to deal with problems
- unusual opportunities or urgent community needs
- cost reductions towards becoming self-sufficient

The Committee will then consider the following criteria:

- seriousness of need
- degree of benefit to the community
- level of co-operation with like-minded groups
- funds awarded are sufficient to enable the group
- degree of volunteerism
- capacity to be self-sustaining
- use of local suppliers

The Screen Smart Program certainly addresses emerging needs. This program focuses its efforts on one week when children are asked to sign a pledge to be screen-free. Daily activities are provided with the hope that children will improve their social skills, reduce obesity and prevent diabetes. This program is unique to Revelstoke and is one we should all be proud of.

Revelstoke Awareness and Outreach Program, A street level program for mental health, operates a small but cozy drop-in center with lots of volunteer help. Peers are recruited and trained to help others in a warm and safe environment.

Revelstoke's oldest and newest sport groups benefited from Foundation grants. The Ski Club was in need of upgrades to its timing and safety equipment and a new group was trying to start a Lacrosse League.

The Nickelodeon, Revelstoke Museum and Archives, Railway Museum and Forestry Museum together with the Visual Arts Centre formed a Marketing Collective and, with a Foundation grant have been able to promote themselves across the country.

The Columbia Basin Alliance for Literacy runs a Family Literacy program that encourages early cognitive development with parental participation. With sufficient funding many of these programs are either free or at as low a cost as possible.

The Columbia Park Elementary Accelerated Reader Program was funded to re-stock their AR library. Their students had become such voracious readers that the supply of books was not able to keep up.

Seniors helping seniors was an initiative to get more seniors informed and involved with new programs. Computer courses, swimming pool access, new pool equipment, dart boards and fitness passes were just some of the benefits of this program.

Community Connections continues to be at the forefront in youth leadership. Four programs were funded involving all age groups of youth. Some youths simply need an organized outing to get exposure to new activities while others need guidance with social and job skills.

Community Connections also maintains the Food Bank and we are proud to help subsidize the transportation of free food stuffs from generous donors in bigger centers back to Revelstoke for free distribution.

The Foundation helped fund free tickets to 13 drama students and 12 worthy recipients to attend the Kootenay Zone Drama Festival presented by the Revelstoke Theatre Company.

The Revelstoke Arts Council received a grant to run week-long art camps for children under professional guidance.

Both the Revelstoke Hospice Society and the Revelstoke Women's Shelter were funded to do their quiet but vital jobs.

Thank you to all the groups, volunteers, and participants that we have the privilege to help. With your help the Revelstoke Community Foundation can fulfil its mandate which is; "To improve the quality of life for the people of Revelstoke."

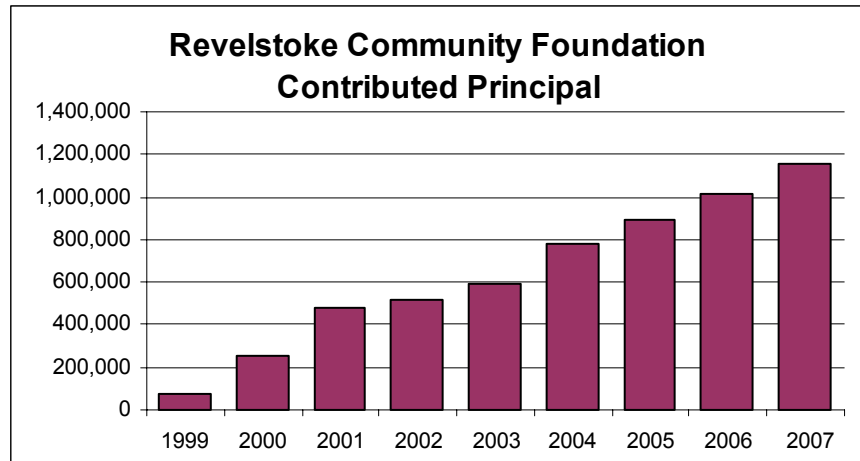

BUILDING OUR ENDOWMENT

Contributions to the endowment fund during 2007 were \$145,810. At December 31, 2007 contributions since inception totalled \$1,156,907. The continued growth of the endowment is a tribute to the citizens of Revelstoke who are working to improve the quality of life for all in our community.

In 2007 the Foundation provided \$48,318 in grants and scholarships. In the eight years that it has been making grants, the Foundation has been able to distribute \$172,416 to support projects in Revelstoke and \$42,265 to individuals in the form of scholarships.

Thanks to our volunteers and generous support from the Revelstoke Credit Union and Revelstoke Community Futures, operating costs charged to the fund continue to be less than one half of one percent. The very low administrative costs leave increased funds for grants and scholarships
